## /// Objet: Blasting work

Greetings,

Blasting will take place in your area in the next few days. This letter is intended to inform you of the procedures related to this type of work.

As a reminder, each blast will proceed according to the following four steps:



1. Twelve fast shots of siren



2. Pause of thirty seconds



3. Blasting is done



4. A long siren sound indicates the end of the blasting

Rest assured that all drilling and blasting work will be done according to the rules of the art and in accordance with federal, provincial and municipal legal requirements.

A vibration detector (seismograph) will be installed at the structure closest to the work area to record the vibrations and frequencies generated by blasting, as required by the regulations in force.

If your home or building is within one hundred (100) meters of the planned blasting, a prevention officer will conduct an exterior video inspection of the building to observe the condition of surrounding structures prior to the work. The prevention agent will also meet you to install a carbon monoxide detector that will be loaned to you for the duration of the work and fourteen (14) days after the end of these (in accordance with the BNQ 1809 standard). -350/2012 from the Guide to Preventive Practice). The agent will explain how it works and provide you with the necessary information for its use.
