8.6 Progressive accounting number 6—Stokes Street project

8.7 Request to the government of Quebec – Tighten the supervision of fertilizing residuals

WHEREAS fertilizing residual materials ("MRFs") are industrial or municipal residues, composed in particular of sludge from wastewater treatment;

WHEREAS in recent years, legislative changes and administrative flexibility related to the recycling of MRFs have been made by the Government of Quebec;

WHEREAS the Radio-Canada reports on the spreading of municipal sludge, one on the television show *La Semaine verte* and one on the *Enquête* show, highlight several problems related to the use of MRFs on agricultural land in Quebec and the United States;

WHEREAS MRFs contain contaminants such as cadmium, dioxins, furans and many others that are still unknown to the Ministry of the Environment, the Fight against Climate Change, Wildlife and Parks ("MELCCFP");

WHEREAS there is limited existing data on the levels of biosolids in relation to emerging contaminants such as drugs, hormones, plastics and PFAS;

WHEREAS PFAS are perfluoroalkyl and polyfluoroalkyl substances whose molecules, rather than degrading, accumulate in the environment;

WHEREAS PFAS are associated with reproductive, developmental, endocrine, liver, kidney and immune system problems and are considered by the International Agency for Research on Cancer to be possibly carcinogenic to humans;

WHEREAS the many chemicals found in MRFs can cause irreversible damage to the environment and their use in the context of agricultural activities can have serious consequences on the water quality of the surrounding groundwater and, ultimately, on the quality of life of citizens;

WHEREAS the State of Maine in the United States, in the light of an investigation, recently banned the spreading of sewage sludge on its territory while it better establishes the dangerousness of the materials it may contain;

WHEREAS the report of the television show *Enquête* broadcast by Radio-Canada has shown that sewage sludge from the United States is nevertheless spread on agricultural land in Quebec;

WHEREAS the supervision of the MRF industry is insufficient, as evidenced by the samples taken by Radio-Canada as part of its investigation, which showed much higher levels of PFAS than the standards established by the MELCCFP;

WHEREAS the MELCCFP entrusts only agronomists with the responsibility of developing agri-environmental recycling plans for farmers, while they may also be employed by recovery companies, which tends to place them in a conflict of interest position;

THEREFORE

IT IS PROPOSED BY Councillor Vanessa Chapman, SECONDED BY Councillor Karrie Parent,

AND CARRIED TO the Municipality of Bury asks the government of Quebec to apply the precautionary principle in the management of MRFs by ceasing to authorize their spreading on agricultural lands in Quebec through a moratorium, and this, while a public debate takes place on the issue and that a strict regulatory framework be adopted in order to prevent high concentrations of emerging

contaminants such as drugs, hormones, plastics and PFAS from spreading in the environment;

THAT the Municipality of Bury asks the Government of Quebec to review the framework of the MRF industry so as to prevent agronomists in the industry from being in conflict of interest;

THAT this resolution be forwarded to the MELCCFP, the Ministry of Health and Social Services ("MSSS"), the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food of Quebec ("MAPAQ"), the Union des agricultural producers ("UPA") to the office of the provincial deputy Mr. François Jacques, to the office of the federal deputy Mrs. Marie-Claude Bibeau, to the Fédération québécoise des municipalités ("FQM"), to the Union des municipalités du Québec ("UMQ") as well as at the MRC du Haut-Saint-François.
