8.8 Request to the financial aid program for the volunteer and part time firefighter training

WHEREAS the «*Règlement sur les conditions pour exercer au sein d'un service de sécurité incendie municipal*» requires fire safety training for firefighters in order to ensure a minimum of professional qualification;



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WHEREAS this Bylaw is part of a commitment to ensure that the municipalities provides the firefighting teams with the skills and abilities necessary to respond effectively to emergency situations;

WHEREAS in December of 2014, the Quebec government established the Financial Assistance Program for the training of volunteers or part-time firefighters;

WHEREAS the main objective of this program is to provide municipal organizations for financial assistance to enable them to have a sufficient number of qualified firefighters to act effectively and safely in an emergency;

WHEREAS this program also aims to promote the acquisition of skills and basic skills required by volunteer firefighters and part-time practicing in municipal fire safety services;

WHEREAS the Bury Municipality wishes to receive financial assistance offered by the program;

WHEREAS the Municipality of Bury foresee the training of 2 firefighters for Firefighter I and zero firefighter for the Firefighters II program over the next year to respond effectively and safely to emergency situations on its territory;;

WHEREAS the Municipality must send his application to the Ministry of Public Security through the Haut-Saint-François MRC in accordance with Article of the Program;

THEREFORE

8.9. Request to CPTAQ for lots 4 772 918

2017-09-124

WHEREAS Mr. Josy Belzyl (representative for: Transport et Excavation Stéphane Nadeau inc.) wishes to file with the Quebec Agricultural Protection Commission (CPTAQ) an application for authorization to permit the use for another purpose than agriculture and the expansion of the quarry from 6.8 hectares to 8 hectares;

WHEREAS the Commission to preserve agricultural land in Quebec, to consider an application requesting the opinion by resolution of municipalities;

WHEREAS the lots 4 772 918 affected by the application are located in Zone number RUR-43 of zoning bylaw number 339-2008;

WHEREAS the renewal project for a use other than agriculture (sand and gravel pit) does not contravene with the municipal bylaws in force;

WHEREAS lot 4 772 918 has already been authorized for purposes other than agriculture (sand and gravel pit) in the decision CPTAQ 354518 for a period of 10 years;



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WHEREAS the Municipality of Bury must justify its recommendation in accordance with the criteria set out in section 62 of the Act, respecting the preservation of agricultural land and agricultural activities;

The decision criteria provided under section 62 of the Act:

1. The agricultural potential of the lot and surrounding lots; one (1) residence with woodlands. Agriculture in the sector is on a small scale;
2. Possibilities of use for agricultural purposes: This property is located in a partly wooded lot. A sand and gravel pit already installed on the lot, a nearby residence, the grounds of the demand are insufficient for a viable exploitation of agriculture;
3. The consequences of an authorization on existing agricultural activities and on the development of these agricultural activities: The proposed activity, namely the extension of authorization for non-agricultural use (sand and gravel pit) brings no additional disadvantage in the area and the sector.
4. The constraints and effects resulting from the application of laws and bylaws, in particular in regard to the environment. The subject land is already non-agricultural use and the new use requested does not cause any disadvantage for the environment.
5. The availability of alternative locations to eliminate or reduce constraints on agriculture, particularly where the demand is for a lot within a census agglomeration or a census metropolitan area, as defined by Statistics Canada:

N / A, the lot is not located in a census agglomeration.

6. The homogeneity of the community and the farm: the homogeneity of the community and the farm remain unchanged.
7. The effect on agriculture of the water and soil resources in the municipality and in the region: use for purposes other than agriculture (sand and gravel pit) does not change the land. The effect on the preservation of water and soil resources for agriculture remains unchanged.
8. Land that is sufficiently large enough to be used for agriculture: Targeted property is not viable for intensive farming.
9. The effect on the economic development of the region: No change.
10. Socio-economic conditions necessary for the viability of a community where the low density of occupation justifies it.

11. Conformity of the application with the provisions of the zoning bylaw and, where applicable, interim control measures: The recommended use is (sand and gravel pit) authorized in the RUR-43 zone according to zoning bylaw number 339-2008 currently in force.
12. If the request is for the introduction of a new usage, for purposes other than agriculture, the recommendation must also



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include an indication of the availability of suitable space available elsewhere in the municipality and outside the agricultural zone.

The existence of suitable space available elsewhere in the municipality and outside the agricultural zone is not possible.
